Tony Smith, Coryell County GOP Chairman, discussed several bills being considered by the Texas Legislature and encouraged study and support for them:

<u>Senate Bill 8</u>: Relating to public education, including parental rights and public school responsibilities regarding instructional materials and the establishment of an education savings account program.

<u>Senate Bill 22</u>: Relating to the establishment of grant programs to provide financial assistance to qualified sheriff's departments, district attorney's offices, and county attorney's offices in rural counties.

HB 1487: Relating to the creation of a rural county law enforcement grant program.

<u>Senate Bill 34</u>: Relating to the establishment of the Texas Promise Grant Program for certain students at public institutions of higher education.

<u>Senate Bill 35</u>: Relating to the establishment of the Texas Promise Grant Program for certain students at two-year public institutions of higher education.

• Tony has moved CC GOP storage from the storage company which raised the rate from \$55 to \$190 and asked for approval for reimbursement for the costs associated with the new location. Approved.

Members of the newly established <u>Coryell County Republican Women</u> club were present, introduced themselves and said they plan to be officially federated by the Texas Federation of Republican Women soon. Membership is \$36/year, most of which goes to

Kyle Matthews, County Commissioner, spoke on several subjects:

A Tax Note has been done for a 48-bed <u>Expansion of the Jail</u>. This expansion is very important because of the current overcrowding. A deal has been made with Johnson County to help with some overcrowding temporarily.

A Tax Note to build a new <u>Justice Center</u> has been done as well.

In response a question Kyle said that the MHMR building demolition was paid for by an insurance claim.

The Commissioner's Court has been working on catching unscrupulous developers who have been setting up <u>sub-standard subdivisions</u> in the County without proper permits or infrastructure. So far, most set up already do not have houses on them. This is a concern as the small local schools could easily be overwhelmed by a large number of new students from these subdivisions.

Abhiram Garapati, running against John Carter for US Congress, spoke briefly.

Tony Smith ended the meeting with a request for prayers for Ray Ashby who has been in a motorcycle accident and adjourned at 7:33pm.
